INITIATIVE

Many people have to be asked. I once was able to get several people to rally and pull off an event at a school. The principal asked how I got “so and so” to help. I simply asked. I find it interesting that many will sit in the pews with a hidden talent that the church could put to use in its work. They often tell me they were waiting for someone to ask.

Taking the initiative will make things better. Sometimes it takes fresh eyes to identify problems and find new approaches to solutions. There was a marginal Christian at one congregation who only came on Sunday Morning. She felt unneeded. She felt unappreciated. One day, when I was working on a much dreaded landscaping project, she offered to help. She stated it was a passion of hers. In fact, she asked if she could just do it herself. Of course, I quickly agreed. She did a fantastic job. After getting recognition (which is not the reason she did it), she started bringing her small children to bible class and quickly played a significant role in our VBS (1 Thessalonians 5:12).

Taking Initiative isn't just doing something without asking. That something may not be biblical or may not be a need. It could be something that steps on the toes of someone else. Taking initiative in a congregation is

seeing something that needs to be done that fits your talents (Ephesians 4:11). Asking the leadership how you can be involved shows initiative, humility, and can be a catalyst for others to become more involved.

I recently read an online story of a principal who put up a suggestion box. He quickly regretted it. There were so many complaints, and he simply let the box overflow. One anonymous student picked up one that said there was no soap in the bathroom. She brought soap from home and filled it. She then wrote “fixed” and posted it on the wall. Others quickly followed. We are either complainers or fixers (Jude 1:16; Philippians 2:14). I want to be a fixer.

Everyone needs to be involved in a ministry. Your talents are to be used to serve others (1 Peter 4:10-11).
